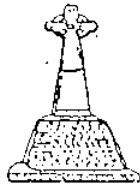

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF BRYMBO COMMUNITY COUNCIL HELD ON
TUESDAY 14TH APRIL 2026 AT BRYMBO SPORTS AND SOCIAL COMPLEX.

The minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 10TH March 2026 were confirmed as a
true record and signed by the Chair.

DECLARATION OF INTEREST-None

2 COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCILLOR'S REPORTS

No apology had been received from CBC Brown or CBC Wellens. No report had
been submitted to the Clerk prior to the meeting from either CBC.

CBC Rogers told members that no application had been submitted for the Mount
Zion site. An enforcement notice was due to be served. CBC Rogers said that he
was very disappointed with CADW as they had not acknowledged any
correspondence in relation to the matter. With regard to Pentre Vron farm there were
on-going issue and complaints had been made to the Chief Officer.

The road resurfacing programme was being put together and would be addressed in
due course. CBC Rogers said that the planning application for Brymbo Road (electric
bike track) needed addressing. No representations had yet been made to WCBC
however residents were extremely concerned and had now made representations to
CBC Rogers. They were concerned with the number of events that the planning
application had listed, use of the car park and also how the event would be
monitored. Members said that this planning application for the electric bike track was
unique and as a result members agreed that any observations would pose a problem
as a number of issues would need to be looked at (volume of traffic, disruption for
local residents and monitoring of the camping situation). CBC Rogers and members
said that the application could be granted on a temporary basis with a view to being

renewed when all observations and representation had been satisfied. CBC Rogers would be making representations based on the above issues. He said that the planning officer and public protection officer would be working together in regard to the application submitted.

The e mail the Clerk had circulated with regard to the solar panels at Pentre Season would impact mostly on Minera and Bwlchgwyn. Bwlchgwyn Cllr's would take the lead with this and advise residents through the village newsletter.

3. END OF YEAR ACCOUNTS (INCOME AND EXPENDITURE) INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The Clerk had circulated copies of all income and expenditure for 2025/2026 and a copy of the investment strategy for 2026/2027 to members prior to the meeting. She said that the Internal Audit was due in the next few weeks. The Chair and Clerk signed the bank reconciliation. Cllr Mathews proposed and Cllr Hughes seconded that the investment strategy be adopted. A vote was taken. All were in favour.

4. PRIDE IN PLACE

The Chair thanked all Councillors for attending the meetings to discuss the projects for the pride in place funding. There were only 2 weeks left to apply for the funding. The funding would be shared proportionally between the 3 communities.

Bwlchgwyn:

3 eligible projects would be put forward for public consultation.

1. Library and youth shelter based at BVHA.
2. Play area/park- extra equipment
3. Football goals, nets and new fencing for the play area.

Tanyfron:

2 projects would be put forward for public consultation.

1. Blackie-develop the garden and monument.
2. Youth shelter/container

Brymbo:

3 projects would be put forward for public consultation based on votes received.

1. Refurbishing the monument Pen y Graig, bus shelter and planters. (7 votes)
2. Refurbishment of play areas, youth shelter at Argoed. (6 votes)
3. Three play areas to receive new equipment (5 votes)

Consultation meetings had been arranged for the following week in order that the timescale be adhered to and the funding not lost. When a decision had been made the Clerk, Chair and Vice Chair would complete the application form for funding.
