

2. POLICING

The police report for Brymbo had been circulated to Brymbo Councillors prior to the meeting.

3. COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCILLOR'S REPORTS

CBC Rogers told members that WCBC had engaged the Rainbow Foundation to oversee the Community Agent project. He was co-ordinating with Environment to discuss improvements to open spaces in the village. He said that with the introduction of the new 20m.p.h speed limit he was working with WCBC to make the transmission easier with the hope of not having to duplicate matters. With regards to the LDP he advised members that he had voted not to adopt it. He was also working with WCBC in relation to congested streets in the housing estate. He said that moving forward in September all 3 CBC's should send their reports to the Clerk the Friday prior to the monthly meeting.

CBC Wellens said that he had been touring the area with Street scene. He had been discussing the problem of flash flooding and was still trying to organise community transport. The issue of his attempt for a carbon reduction plan was proving somewhat difficult however he would be persevering with this. He advised members that he had voted to support the LDP.

CBC Brown had met with members of Plas Brymbo and had overseen the handover of green spaces. He had taken up the issue of the trees that were maintained between the Miners and the Conservative Club. He had voted to support. the LDP.

He had held meetings to explain to residents why he had supported this. He was also holding another meeting in August if Cllr's wished to attend.
