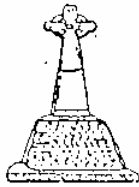

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF BRYMBO COMMUNITY COUNCIL HELD ON TUESDAY 8TH NOVEMBER 2022 AT BRYMBO SPORTS AND SOCIAL COMPLEX

The minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 11th October 2022 were confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

2. POLICING

Both Brymbo/Tanyfron and Bwlchgwyn crime report had been circulated to members prior to the meeting.

3. COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCILLOR'S REPORTS

CBC Brown said that he had held discussions with residents in Brymbo. He said that he was a member of the cost of living group and was working to address warm spaces across the County Borough Council. He had attended Plas Brymbo Residents meetings and was exploring funding opportunities for the Enterprise Centre. He told members that the school site was still live. He sent his apologies as he would not be able to attend the Christmas Lights switch on that BCC were organising on the 24/11/2022.

CBC Rogers said that with regards to the school site there had been interesting discussions with the developer. There were 2 streams of funding available. The first being the natural 21st school programme and the 2nd was a competition for funding across Wales through the eco-school project. The Brymbo site had been put forward for this. CBC Rogers said that he had met with Dafydd Ifans and Karen Evans regarding road safety issues at Tanyfron School. There were concerns regarding transferring pupils between buildings. Improvements re car parking were discussed and also a road safety assessment was to take place and hopefully fencing to be

erected behind the school. He said that the bollards that had been placed there seemed to be working. CBC Rogers said that regular worship at St. Mary's Church seemed to be in decline and that the Friends of St Mary's Church were looking to take on the lease. He said that they were hopeful that the Church would be open for other events in the future. CBC thanked the trustees of Friends of St. Mary's Church for all their work in trying to secure the future of the building. With regards to the doctor's surgery CBC Rogers said that the Health Board had overlooked the lease on the building however this was now secure and should be opening soon.

4. ROADS

Cllr Griffiths asked about the progress of the signs for Tanyfron. The Chair said that the new team at WCBC would be completing the backlog of work. Cllr Griffiths said that an incident had occurred on Heritage Way and there was a need for some sort of crossing there. The Chair agreed and said he would speak to highways re costings etc. and bring back to full Council. This would be placed on the Agenda for the New Year.

6. PLAYING FIELDS AND PLAYGROUNDS

Cllr Mathews said that the new cabinet for the de-fib had been put in at Bronwens Green and he only now needed to purchase a new lock for the gate.

7. FOOTPATHS/LIGHTING

Cllr Rogers said that the Christmas lights were mostly up and the few the remaining ones due to be completed in the next week. Cllr Mathews told members that the footpath by Engedi Chapel had been blocked off by overgrown Japanese knotweed. CBC Rogers said he would speak to Planning and Highways. The Chair said that Mega Electrical had done a fantastic job as there had been a number of issues that needed to be resolved. He said that BCC needed to look to accelerate the lighting column project.

8. WAR MEMORIAL

Cllr Rogers says that the poppies had been placed on lamppost in the villages and the Remembrance Service at Brymbo was to start at 3.00 p.m.
